Learning outcomes of the course unit: <i>Students by completing the course will gain the basic knowledge of concepts relating to the state, its creation, symptoms as fundamentally different features from other communities, state functions, the form of the state and forms of governments. The student should be able to define democracy, define its forms and to characterize its substance, also should know the territorial and the organizational structure of state, the state and political regime. Student should understand the legal system in general, the state legal system, sources of legal norms, whether material or formal. After completion of the course student should be able to do an analysis of the various stages of the legislative process, analysis of the political system by defining its subjects. The student should be prepared to study further knowledge of particular law sectors in terms of the following subjects.</i>	
Course contents: <i>1. State of origin, concept of law, characteristics of the state, functions of state. 2. Forms of state and forms government. 3. Democracy and its forms. 4. The theory of division of power and parliamentary. 5. State regimes, types of national regimes. 6. Political regimes, sorts of political regimes. 7. Territorial and organizational structure of state (establishment). 8. The state bodies and institutions system. 9. Legal systems, the concept of low, characteristics of low. 10. The law system and legal sectors, sources of law. 11. The legal standard, concept, characteristics, types of laws, lawmaking process. 12. Subjective rights, legal relations, legal facts, legal acts. 13. The application and interpretation of law.</i>
