During the semester, students will write tests with the total number 40 points. The final score: rating A - at least 91 points, rating B - at least 81 points, rating C - at least 71 points, rating D at least 61 points D, rating E - at least 51 points. At the end of the semester during the examination period: Credit. Final evaluation: Achieved average.

Learning outcomes of the course unit:

A student by passing subject gets basic knowledge about the global economy - on its basic entities and relationships between them: international economic relations, its structure and functioning at present, the main forms and manifestations of international relations in the regulation of international economic institutions and perspective heavily dependent relationship between various economies of the world. A student will be able to analyze the internationalization of economic relations in their specific forms, know the issues of international trade, international monetary system, the movement of capital and labor will be notified of monetary relations and international economic integration and its institutionalization within the triad world economy, current issues in the world economy turbulent context of globalization processes and ultimately will be acquainted with the problems of analysis and forecasts of the world economy. A student will understand the basic concepts of international issues ranging from trade international division of labor, disassemble the theory of international trade. A student is able to define and explore the world economy and trends that are reflected in the various stages of its development, particularly globalization, scientific and technological progress and liberalization of world trade. Subject analyzes the triad economy status and functioning of individual economies in it: the US, EU, Japan, the new the rapidly growing economies (China, India, Brazil, Argentina, Chile, Russia). It explores subjects of the global economy - the national economy, transnational corporations and international economic integration groupings. It also explores the international movement of factors of production: the international movement of capital, services and labor in response to international human resource management and corporate social responsibility. After successful completion of a learning process, the student will be able to do the analysis of global problems of the world economy as: energy and food security, the problem of poverty, socio-economic backwardness of the developing countries and their debt problem.

Course contents:

1. The international division of labor, foreign trade and its functions. Foreign trade policy: principles, means.

Theory of International Trade: Traditional, non-classical, Keynesian, Kindleberger.
 The world economy: The world economy, the economic theory of complex triad of the world economy.

4. US economy. Economic development, foreign trade policy.

5. Japan's economy. Socio-economic system of the Japanese economy, politics interventionism.

6. Economy of the European Communities. European economic integration, a single internal market, external trade relations.

7. The status of China, India, Latin America (Brazil, Argentina, Chile) and Russia in international economic relations as a newly developing centers of the world economy. 8. The international movement of factors of production: the international movement of capital / transnational corporations, technology, innovation and competitiveness in the context of the global

9. The international movement of factors of production: the international movement of labor migration policy (international migration, causes, consequences for emigrant (immigration country, forms).

10. International Human Resource Management: definition, approaches. Social Corporate Responsibility.

11. Globalization and integration processes in the system of the world economy. Typology of global issues, long-term sustainable development of the world economy.

Global problems of the world economy: energy and resource problem in the global economy, energy security: a vision, direction, strategy The global problems of the world economy: environmental problem, population and food problem, the problem of poverty, socio-economic backwardness of developing countries, the problem of debt. 13.
