Assesment methods:

For successful pass of the seminars is to be a minimum of 40 points, students who fail to collect the minimum points will not be allowed to take the exam. During the semester there will be two written assignments a maximum of 10 + 10 points. The student is required to prepare a seminar paper on a chosen topic - max 15 points under the Exam writing guidelines. Consequently, it is required to present a topic to a group in format of PowerPoint - max.30 points. Assessment A -80% course content, Assessment B - 70% course content, Assessment C - 65% course content, Assessment D - 60% course content, Assessment E - 55% course content. The final grading: total score of points.

Learning outcomes of the course unit:

The student completing this course gets a comprehensive system of knowledge of modern psychology personality as a science, its history, methods and subsequently application areas. The student will be able to use basic psychological concepts of personality: psyche, consciousness, unconsciousness, activity, behavior and survival. Student will be able to characterize the personality, its features and characteristics as differentiating features. The student will know the genesis of personality and its development stages, cognitive processes - feeling, perception, memory, attention, thinking as well as emotions and motivation individual. The student will understand the structure of personality and various theoretical approaches in its definition, the psyche and its biological and social conditionality and psychological components control of the individual. After successful completion of a learning process, the student will be able to do self-recognition and recognition functions of mental control other people know distinguish mutable personality characteristics of genetically determined and will be ready to exploit the knowledge on the structure personalities for their professional work HR manager.
