Marginal approach to production costs, theory of imperfect competition. 7. Theory of company, economy of prosperity. 8. Neo-Austrian school - F.A.von Hayek, Ludwig von Mises. 9. J. M. Keynes and his contribution to the development of economic science, further development of Keynesian economics. 10. Neoliberalism and model of social market economy. 11. Economic theory of monetarism. 12. Chicago School, theory of rational expectation, new classic macroeconomics. 13. Theory of economic offer, institutional economic theories – institutional and neo-institutional economy, new institutional economy.</i>
